PASTOR'S COLUMN

First - Sherri and I (and the younger ones too) want to give you all our heartfelt thanks for your generosity and kindness during the Advent and Christmas seasons. It really is a gift to us to be able to serve and live with you all. Trust me, we do not take it for granted. Blessings to you all now, and in the new year!

Second - I want to double back (briefly) on one of the readings from the Christmas Eve service:

¹¹For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, ¹²training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, ¹³waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, ¹⁴Who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works. Titus 2:11-14 (ESV)

Those of you who were able to be with us or watch the service on You Tube, remember that the emphasis for the sermon that night was on God making Himself visible to us in Jesus, and what it means for us to be able to see Him and His love for us in Christ. But, you'll notice in St. Paul's words to his colleague, Titus, God's coming to us in Christ is about more than simply being able to see Him.

At verse 11, Paul begins with what the incarnation of Jesus means for the world. God's grace - His undeserved, unearned, good will toward all of a fallen humanity - that has been made visible in Jesus. In Jesus we see God's work to save us that flows from His love and grace. And, indeed, the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus has brought salvation to all. Yet, the nature of the Christian life is not to say, "I'm saved - hoorah!" and go on about your business as if nothing has changed. God has come to you in Christ, and you are saved, **FOR** a purpose.

And what is that purpose? Simply that sharing Christ's life, you return to fellowship with God and live as holy people. And this is what Paul goes on to describe for Titus. Being saved in Christ, seeing God's grace in Him, we then learn to renounce our own un-godliness and worldly passions. For Paul, "worldly passions" and "ungodliness" are more or less the same. When your heart and mind are set on this world, and you are living by its rules alone, you are by definition not being "godly" (i.e., you are not having your heart and mind shaped by Him and His love for you). Worldly passions are the dispositions and enthusiasms a fallen world encourages us to run with. The desire for more "stuff." The need for constant diversion or entertainments. The building up of our egos. Suspicion of others. Bitterness. Hatred. Lust. Resentment. Envy. All these are passions we suffer with because of our inheritance from Adam, and because we still live "in" the world even if we are no longer "of it." So, because God has come (and continues to come) to us in Christ, we need to focus on saying

“no” to the passions that pull us away from the life God is come to give us. It struck me the other day, teaching over at Concordia, that almost all the major world religions have a common element, in that all of them pretty much call us to “get over” ourselves. They have radically different ideas of what that means, and what the “self” is. But, for us, God coming to us in Christ means that we need to get over ourselves – and that begins with renouncing the worldly passions.

What stands in contrast to the worldly passions is the self-controlled, upright, and godly life we are given in Christ. Self-control means not giving into the world’s attitudes and temptations. In Christ, you can control yourself – perhaps not all your feelings, but certainly many of your behaviors. And even when passion gets the better of you, in self-control you can repent and start over again. What is “upright” is simply what is good and honorable in the sight of God. When your passions aren’t controlling you, you have the freedom to pursue what is right and proper. And that is found in God and His life – so as you share and grow in faith, you will find that you become more “godly” – meaning that more and more of your life is informed by what you are called to and given in Christ.

And that leads to hope – a hope for the day for His return. And as we wait, what? We are zealous for good works. We want to do what is right, beneficial, and gracious for others.

Jesus is come, and now, in Him, we have light and life. Let us go and live that life – not just for the Twelve Days of Christmas – but for the whole of the new year. For irrespective of COVID, the economy, national politics, or international events – the grace of God has appeared to us in Christ – Who remains with us always.


IN CASE OF BAD WEATHER –

Friendship SOUP

Make jars of Italian barley soup to share love and warmth with friends.



What you need:

- 1 cup pearly barley
- ½ cup sundried tomatoes
- 1 Tbsp dry minced garlic
- 1 Tbsp dry minced onion
- 1 veggie bouillon cube
- Glass pint jars with lids
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Pen

What you do:

1. In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar.
2. Trace the outline of the lid onto cardstock. Cut out.
3. On the card, write these directions: Remove wrapper from bouillon cube. Add contents of jar to saucepan. Add 4 cups water and a can of diced tomatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce to low. Simmer about 20 minutes, until barley is tender. Serve with parmesan cheese.
4. Place the card atop the lid. Screw on the canning ring to keep it in place.

COVID-19 ERA —Phase 5I-

While Illinois is officially “Open,” we want to take things at a cautious pace here at Mt. Calvary. So here’s where we are for now --

Worship Schedule - We’ll hold steady with our current offerings until the Omicron variant dies down.

Thursdays - 6:00 pm. This will be a spoken communion service, two readings, one hymn (sung a cappella). Attendance will be capped at 30.

Sundays - 8:00, 9:00, 11:45 am. Single use bulletins will be available for all services. 8:00 and 11:45 am services will still be “abbreviated,” but with hymns and extra readings. Both will offer communion every week and will be capped at 30 people in attendance. The 9:00 service will be basically the same - except that there won’t be a limit to attendance (technically, we’re capped at 60% of the sanctuary’s capacity for seating, but that’s 153.... So, apart from Christmas or a sudden revival, that’s not an issue for us right now). Generally, communion will be offered on 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays for the 9:00 am service, and Matins on the other Sundays.

Masking and Physical Distancing -Per Gov. Pritzker’s executive order, we will ask all people entering the building to wear masks. You can still visit unmasked outside. You may remove the mask to receive the elements of Holy Communion or to eat and drink during fellowship or Bible Study. We know there is debate on the issue, but as this doesn’t involve matters of faith, we are called to give respect where it is due

Food - Given the number of people choosing to be “in-person” for the Adult Class, we’re not ready to order donuts or make a big pot of coffee. However, there have been generous members of the class who have been brewing coffee in smaller quantities, and even bringing donuts to share. Since eating together is such an important aspect of our common life, we encourage this to continue until we are ready to return to our previous routine.

Other Issues:

1. *Regular Office hours* - will continue - feel free to call or visit.

2. *Worship Videos* - We will continue to offer a video of the main service from Sunday morning on our You Tube channel:

3. *Sign-ups* - We will continue to use Sign-Up Genius to pre-register attendance. While this is not so crucial for the 9:00 am service on Sunday, your use of this tool allows us to be better stewards as we print bulletins and set up for communion. Here’s the link for January:

4. *Bible Studies* - We will continue to be “Brushing Up on the Catechism!” in the Sunday morning Bible Study. You may attend by Zoom or in person - 10:30 am. The men are now reading 1 Corinthians. We will be at Gebby’s Family Restaurant, 726 East War Memorial Drive in Peoria Heights. There will be no Zoom - attendance is in person only. Rumors indicate the Wednesday evening Bible Study might return in September.

5. *Challenge* - As we come back together, we still need to be connected to one other in ways deeper than just a wave and a smile. One of the things St. Paul commends to us as the “body of Christ” is to share each other’s joys and burdens. Turns out, you can do that by phone, even with someone you don’t “know” all that well. So, I urge you all to join me (if you can) in “calling around the congregation” to check in on each other, get to know each other and encourage each other. And if there’s someone you’re “missing” as you come back to in-person worship, track that person down. Lost your directory? Judy will send you a new one.

6. *Stewardship during COVID-19* - While God has blessed us with a “cushion” financially during these odd days, the ministries of Mt. Calvary still need your support - whether it’s Judy taking care of the office, Pastor Long trying to provide study and worship opportunities, the

Pantry continuing to reach out to our area, or Mr. Tagge providing music. The Treasurer's Report for November 2021 showed year to date expenses of \$344,472.03, and offerings of \$345,246.37 which includes \$60,000.00 transferred from the endowment and \$1,193.00 from Thrivent. Please, prayerfully continue to send in your contributions.

General Wisdom: - Some quick reminders for those of you attending the "larger" worship service on Sundays (and things for everyone to consider).

1. If you are not feeling well or have a temperature 100 degrees Fahrenheit or over, please stay home and get well.
2. If you are in a "high risk" category and don't feel safe, then also continue to take proper care - but make sure you are in touch with us so we can properly minister to you.
3. Right now Illinois requires masking indoors, vaccinated or not.
4. In the sanctuary we will continue to leave empty pews to "space" folks, however, in a given pew, you are free to sit as close to or far away from others as you are comfortable with. Signs indicate which pews should be left empty.
5. Single use bulletins will be available as you enter the nave. Please leave them in the recycling container when you depart (unless you are taking yours home).
6. Communion will still be brought to you in the pew.
7. The offering plate will be at the entrance of the nave for you to leave offerings as you are so moved.
8. You may socialize in the building, masked, and keeping safe distances; otherwise, please do your visiting outside (weather permitting).
9. If you have not indicated your preference for individual or common cup at communion, please go back to Sign Up Genius and do so (it allows us to prepare ahead of time). Remember, we are continuing to offer an abbreviated communion service for those who feel

more comfortable in a smaller setting and with shorter time indoors. And we will continue to make a service available on YouTube for those who prefer to worship remotely.


